

THE Centre

The Glenorchy Centre is situated in the small north Derbyshire town of Wirksworth on the edge of the Peak District National Park. The Centre is suitable for self-catering groups of all ages including family groups. The Glenorchy is an ideal

base for week long holidays, week-end breaks or anything in between. The centrally heated accomodation comprises one 14 bed and one 12 bed dormitory and two 2 bedded rooms all with showers and toilets. Sheets and duvets are provided. There is a fitted kitchen with dining area and a large multi-purpose room (with a stage measuring 20 x 14ft.) ideal for recreation, discussions, conferences etc. TV, table tennis and a snooker table are provided.



The centre is managed by the United Reformed Church and takes its name from a former benefactor - Lady Glenorchy.

These facilities are ideal for school parties, youth & uniformed groups, students, family and friendship groups who wish to explore this attractive area and those who just want a weekend away from the bustle of city life.

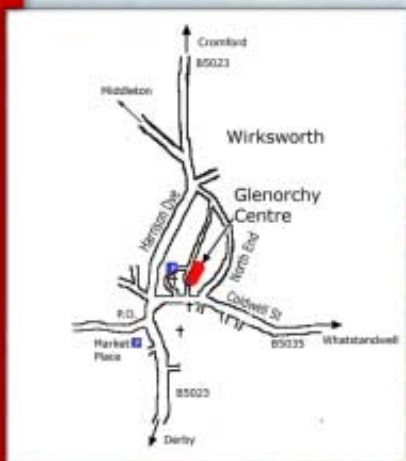


A few minutes walk in any direction from the town will find you in the rolling Derbyshire countryside with the particularly attractive Black Rocks beauty spot providing a safe adventure site for the young.

Also within walking distance is the High Peak Trail where walking, pony trekking and cycling can be enjoyed. Bicycles can be hired from Middleton Top.

There is a good variety of shops in Wirksworth and a major programme of conservation and repair has resulted in many of the significant buildings being restored to their original splendour.

LOCATION



The town is served by regular bus services to Derby (12 miles) the market town of Bakewell (10 miles) and Matlock (5 miles) whilst Matlock Bath (3 miles) will be of particular interest to those who prefer the more demanding pursuits, providing excellent opportunities for canoeing and rock climbing.

Nearer still is the village of Cromford where the Arkwright Mills are open to the public. The Cromford canal built close to Sir Richard Arkwright's industrial complex now provides pleasant walks along its bank to the junction with the High Peak Trail at Lea & beyond.

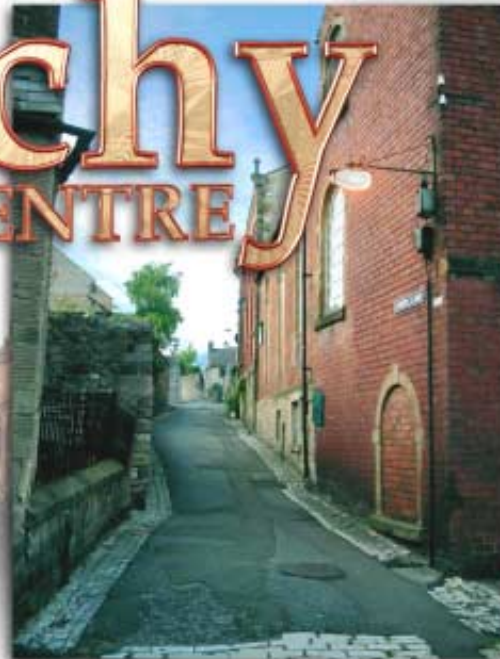
